

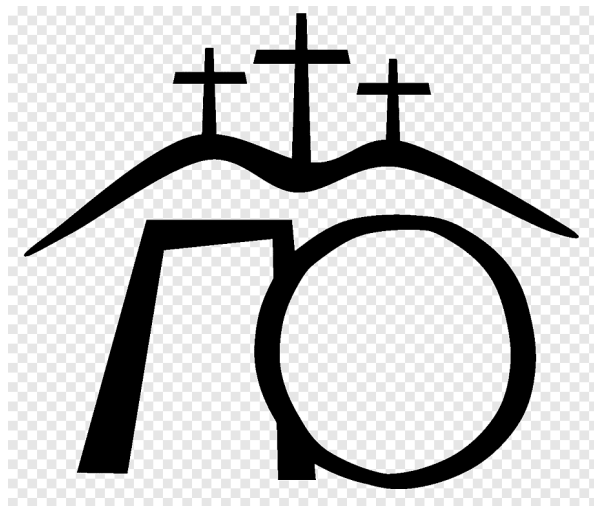

The Pentecost Reading

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (2.1-13)

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, 'Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs – in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power.' All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, 'What does this mean?'

The reader says

The Lord is here.

All His Spirit is with us.

Prayer for Personal Renewal

Parishioners are invited to come forward to the altar rail to receive prayer for personal renewal and anointing. Oil of Chrism is used.

Oil is brought forward, the bearer saying

Oil for the renewal of God's people.

The president says

Be with us, Spirit of God;

All nothing can separate us from your love.

Breathe on us, breath of God;

All fill us with your saving power.

Speak in us, wisdom of God;

All bring strength, healing, and peace.

While the hymn is sung, those who wish to receive this ministry of prayer come forward to the altar rail.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

[all sit]

Psalm 104.24-25, 27-30

²⁴ O Lord, how manifold are your works!

In wisdom you have made them all:

the earth is full of your creatures.

²⁵ Yonder is the sea, great and wide:

creeping things innumerable are there,

living things both small and great.

²⁷ These all look to you:

to give them their food in due season.

²⁸ When you give to them, they gather it up:

when you open your hand, they are filled with good things.

²⁹ When you hide your face, they are dismayed:

when you take away their breath, they die

and return to their dust.

³⁰ When you send forth your spirit, they are created:

and you renew the face of the ground.

A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians.

1 Cor. 12:1-13

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says 'Let Jesus be cursed!' and no one can say 'Jesus is Lord' except by the Holy Spirit.

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

THE PROFESSION OF CHRISTIAN FAITH

The priest addresses the congregation

Priest Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

All I believe in God, the Father almighty,

and is seated at the right hand of the Father;
from there he will come to judge
the living and the dead.

the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting. Amen.

The priest introduces the prayers of the people

We ask you to reveal in our lives the love of Jesus.

We thank you for the *breath* of your Holy Spirit,
given us by the risen Lord.

We ask you to keep the whole Church, living and departed,
in the joy of eternal life.

Lord, come to bless us

Generous God,

you sent your Holy Spirit upon your Messiah at the river Jordan,
and upon the disciples in the upper room:

in your mercy fill us with your Spirit,

THE GREETING OF PEACE

The priest says

The risen Christ came and stood among his disciples and said,
'Peace be with you!' Then were they glad when they saw the Lord.
Alleluia. Alleluia.

The peace of the risen Christ be always with you.

Let us turn to one another and offer a gesture of peace.

All exchange a sign of peace, turning to one another and offering a gesture of peace.

During the offertory hymn, the altar is prepared, and the collection is taken up.

OFFERTORY HYMN

seek thou this soul of mine,

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

The priest begins the Eucharistic Prayer. The sursum corda is sung

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is indeed right, it is our duty and our joy,
always and everywhere to give you thanks,
holy Father, almighty and everlasting God,
through Jesus Christ, your only Son our Lord.

This day we give you thanks
because in fulfilment of your promise
you pour out your Spirit upon us,
filling us with your gifts, leading us into all truth,
and uniting peoples of many tongues in the confession of one faith.
Your Spirit gives us grace to call you Father,
to proclaim your gospel to all nations
and to serve you as a royal priesthood.
Therefore we join our voices with angels and archangels,
and with all those in whom the Spirit dwells,
to proclaim the glory of your name,
for ever praising you and singing:

The sanctus is sung

Holy. Holy. Holy Lord.

God of power and might.

Heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

...Great is the mystery of faith.

The memorial acclamation is sung

Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

... in songs of never-ending praise:

**Blessing and honour and glory and power
are yours for ever and ever. Amen.**

The priest says

Rejoicing in God's new creation, as our Saviour taught us, so we pray:

Our Father in heaven,

hallowed be your name,

your kingdom come,

your will be done,

on earth as in heaven.

Give us today our daily bread.

Forgive us our sins,

as we forgive

those who sin against us.

Save us from the time of trial,

and deliver us from evil.

For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours,

now and for ever. Amen.

BREAKING OF THE BREAD AND COMMUNION

The priest breaks the consecrated bread.

Jesus says, 'I am the bread of life,
whoever eats this bread will live for ever'.

**All: Lord, our hearts hunger for you;
give us this bread always.**

The Agnus Dei is sung

Jesus, Lamb of God, have mercy on us.
Jesus, bearer of our sins, have mercy on us.
Jesus, redeemer of the world, grant us your peace.

The priest says

Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.
Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.

All baptised Christians are invited to receive the bread and the wine of the Eucharist. This includes children, from the age of 5, at the discretion of their parents. Please tell the priest if you prefer to receive a gluten free wafer or a blessing. A blessing may be indicated by folding your arms across your chest at the communion rail.

Silence is kept

The priest leads the post communion prayer

O God,
who taught the hearts of your faithful people
by sending to them the light of your Holy Spirit:
grant us by the same Spirit
to have a right judgment in all things,
and evermore to rejoice in his holy comfort;
through the merits of Jesus Christ our Saviour,
who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the same Spirit,
one God, now and for ever. **All Amen.**

The priest and the congregation say together the prayer

**God of Mission,
Who alone brings growth to your Church,
Send your Holy Spirit to give,
Vision to our planning,
Wisdom to our actions,
Joy to our worship
And power to our witness.
Help our church to grow in numbers,**

In spiritual commitment to you,
And in service to our local community,
Through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Father,
we offer ourselves to you
as a living sacrifice
through Jesus Christ our Lord.
Send us out in the power of your Spirit
to live and work to your praise and glory.
Amen.
